In the 2020 Legislative Session, House Bill 319 (Laws of 2020, Chapter 66, Codified as Section 13-1-154.1 NMSA 1978) was enacted into law requiring state agencies and local public bodies to report the number of contracts and the amount of those contracts for contractors awarded under multiple source awards commencing March 4, 2020, and reporting quarterly. The statute reads, in pertinent part:

to be spent under each multiple source contract pursuant to this section. The general services department may promulgate rules regarding reporting to the department pursuant to this subsection."

Before any local public body chief procurement officer (CPO) may access the portal to enter data, each CPO must register with SPD by submitting a CPO Designation Certification letter to Mr. Richard

Upon receipt of the executed letter, SPD will verify the information and approve the CPO registration. Access to the portal will not occur unless these steps are followed. Although the statute does not explicitly mention cooperative purchasing groups, keep in mind that such groups formed by Joint Powers Agreements can only be afforded the powers and obligations of the entities creating them. Therefore, these entities act on the part of local public bodies when performing those functions (such as procurement) that have been given them by the local public bodies through the Joint Powers Agreement Act. The obligation of reporting such contract expenditures flows through to the

"Section 13-1-154.1.F. NMSA 1978 A state agency and *a local public body*, not including an agency of the legislative or judicial branch of state government, shall report to the legislative finance committee on an annual basis and to the purchasing division of the general services department on, at minimum, a quarterly basis the aggregate amount of contracts for each contractor and the corresponding amounts
